2016 Pre- Conference Health Literacy Workshop

10am -3pm, Wednesday, 19 October 2016 Level 1, 50 Lonsdale Street, Melbourne

Health literacy is the degree to which individuals have the capacity to obtain, process, and understand basic health information and services needed to make appropriate health decisions. Health literacy is dependent on individual and systemic factors. Low levels of individual health literacy have been reported to contribute to poorer health outcomes, increased risk of an adverse event and higher healthcare costs. Health literacy plays a crucial role in chronic disease self-management.

This workshop will provide an overview of health literacy, some of the tools available to measure health literacy and generate change. There will also be some practical approaches to harnessing the knowledge gained from specific health literacy projects to improve quality and safety in health care.

This meet the expert session will cover current and upcoming health literacy tools being used locally and/or globally. These include the Health Education Impact Questionnaire (heiQ), the Health Literacy Questionnaire (HLQ), and the Ophelia (OPtimising HEalth Literacy and Access) process. Upcoming tools include the e-Health Literacy Framework and Questionnaire (co-developed with Copenhagen University), new organizational health literacy self-assessment framework (to support an organization to become a Health Literate Organization), and the practitioner-patient level CHAT: Conversational Health Literacy Assessment Tool.

Early approaches to health literacy focused primarily on health literacy as health-related reading and numeracy (ie functional health literacy), but health literacy is clearly a multidimentional concept whereby individuals have an individual mix of strengths and needs. Some people can have very low functional health literacy, but have strengths in social support and care quality, thus they can be very successful in their self-care dispite some important weaknesses. Clearly, healthcare professionals and the complexity of the system itself can help or hinder individual individuals and communities. The workshop will also cover the emerging concept of community capacity health literacy.

In summary, the workshop will discuss health literacy for:

- Quality improvement
- Epidemiology
- Patient care
- Health promotion
- Evaluation (for understanding why an intervention worked/didn't work, and outcomes)
- Organisational change
