15th May 2019 Event Summary

The third Integrated Care Community of Practice for the Casey region (within the Monash Health catchment) was held on the 15th May 2019 at Bunjil Place in Naree Warren. The event ran from 6pm to 8pm.

The evening featured a panel discussion involving the care planning referral service from Ambulance Victoria and the Police And CATT Early Response (PACER) for the region. The audience were invited to ask questions which generated discussion. A/Prof Andrew Block from Monash Health Community subsequently presented the Monash Health Community Strategy. A poll (slido) was used at the end of proceedings for anonymous feedback and attendees were invited to stay and network.

Feedback

Twenty-nine attendees provided feedback equating to a response rate of 69%.

93% stated they would attend future events, with 7% not sure.

97% reported they had become aware of a service they were not aware of.

97% met a provider they did not previously know.

100% would recommend the CoP to colleagues.
