

Casey Integrated Care Community of Practice

28th February 2019 Event Summary

The second Integrated Care Community of Practice for the Casey region (within the Monash Health catchment) was held on the 28th February 2019 at Bunjil Place in Naree Warren. The event ran from 6pm to 8pm and was introduced by Professor Don Campbell, Service Director Monash Community.

The evening featured a video vignette of people experiencing persistent pain provided by Dr Tina Campbell, Director of Healthily, the patient education platform. There were subsequent presentations from local services: Monash Community Pain Clinic and Balla Balla Community Centre. Roundtable discussion followed.
