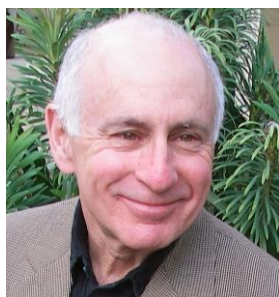

For patients living with chronic disease, their level of activation to manage their condition is critical to health outcomes, healthcare costs, and resource utilization. And their disease often frustrates clinicians (GPs, practice nurses, affiliated health providers), especially when patients are early on in their journey of activation. This workshop is designed to support clinicians as they learn to use measurement of Patient Activation to tailor their approach to the consultation. Using videos of consultations with patients with various level of activation, participants learn specific tools to deploy at each activation level. Tailoring yields more activated patients and more satisfying consultations for both clinicians and patients.

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**CONFERENCE WORKSHOP: *Chronic Diseases and Dementia:  
Exploring the role of Cognition in Successful Self-Management in  
Persons with Dementia***

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*Background*

Health care professionals are increasingly facing the challenges of delivering effective health care to persons with dementia who also have other chronic conditions. The increasing prevalence of age-related chronic illness along with a decline in the availability of informal caregivers calls for innovative thinking. Health services face major challenges in keeping these patients healthy and living independently in the community.



This 1.5 hour seminar provides information for participants about the diagnosis of cognitive impairment, an understanding of an individuals' cognitive abilities and novel ways to assist with self-management. The seminar also describes how different types of cognitive impairment can impair self-management. It will highlight common clinical risks and discusses strategies to support persons with dementia and chronic diseases.

Abstracts can still be submitted for consideration as a poster.

### Submission dates

- **Poster** abstracts will be accepted till 5pm AUST EST on **31 August 2018** however if you would like your abstract printed in the Programme Book please submit no later than 17 August.

### Review process

Abstracts submitted for **oral presentation** will be reviewed by the ADMA Conference Committee. All first or presenting authors will be informed of the outcome of the review by 14 May 2018. Some oral abstracts may be offered poster presentations. Poster presenters will have the opportunity to present a 3 minute overview of their poster during the conference. Posters should be no bigger than 1m x 1m in size.

All accepted abstracts will be published in the Conference Proceedings and will be available to all registrants at the 2018 annual conference. Prizes will be awarded for the best oral presentation and best poster at the close of the conference.

### Abstract guidelines

Abstracts must follow the formatting guidelines and include the additional information below.

#### *Formatting guidelines*

**Document:** Microsoft Word document (compatible with Word 2010)

**Word count:** Maximum 450 words (**or no longer than 1 page**)

**Title:** The abstract title should be in uppercase, Calibri, bold and 12pt

**Authors:** The title should be followed by the presenting author's first name and surname in bold followed by co-authors (initials and surnames). Superscript numbers after each author's name should indicate the authors' affiliation (i.e. department followed by institution/organisation, city, state and country). For example:

**Abstract:** The abstract should be submitted in **11 point Calibri** and **where appropriate** include the following headings:

***Introduction/Background***

***Methods***

***Results***

***Conclusions***

**Figures/tables:** Figures and tables can be included in the abstract. However, the complete abstract **including** any figures/tables should not exceed one page.

**References:** In the text the citations should be in the format of author(s) and year e.g. (Bright, 2010). References should be listed in **alphabetical** order at the end of the abstract and should include the first author's surname and initial(s) followed by "et al" where there is more than one author, the name of the journal, the year of publication, journal volume and page numbers, e.g. Bright JA et al. J Clin Epidemiol, 2010; 55(3):245-50.
