Feedback snapshot. 60% of attendees provided feedback.

95% of respondents would attend future events with 5% not sure.

100% of respondents believe there are benefits in holding regular multidisciplinary and multiservice CoPs for the area.

50% reported they are connected to new people for work matters as a result of attending CoPs.

57% reported attending had impacted their day to day work with 24% reporting this had been their first CoP.
