Feedback snapshot. 73% of attendees provided feedback.

96% of respondents would attend future events with 4% unsure.

100% believed there are benefits in holding regular multidisciplinary and multiservice CoPs.

88% of respondents report that they have become aware of a new service as a result of attending.

43% of respondents report patient care has been impacted by attending and 29% reported that this was their first CoP.

24% have referred a patient to a service they met or became aware of as a result of attending a CoP.
