

Co-design sessions with women, volunteers and community stakeholders to design and implement Two volunteer peer support services: Exercise Buddies, Volunteer Drivers Underpinned by social support

Older people experiencing isolation, loneliness or depressive (ILD) symptoms presenting to ED

ED screening for ILD in older people Followed by 12 x weekly phone calls from trained peer support volunteers Linking with community social support services
